The legal position (as set out in Local Council Administration by Paul Clayton, pp.91-94)

- 10.2 A parish meeting consists of the local government electors [of the parish].
- 10.7 Decisions are taken in the first instance by a majority of those present and voting.
- 10.11 In a few cases [eg regarding the provision of allotments] a resolution [of a parish meeting] is legally binding. In all
 others a resolution is persuasive only; the parish council may legally disregard it and leave the electors to their remedy
 at the next election.
- 10.13 The right of a parish meeting to discuss parish affairs extends to any public matter of a parochial nature and is not confined to the exercise of the statutory functions of the parish council. The parish meeting may accordingly pass resolutions on the public activities or policies in the parish of any other local authority, public or private body, government department or public service provided that they affect the parish specially."
